### **Report on Past Activities:**

#### **Discrimination against immigrants**

The "Welcome Columbus!" committee, formerly known as the "Discrimination against Immigrants" committee, is continuing to push for a more welcoming community. We were not deterred by the absence of the Sheriff and Police Chief from last May's Nehemiah Action.

In recent meetings with Columbus officials, the committee has advocated for a local ordinance that would require all city agencies to recognize consular photo ID cards, such as the Matricula Consular, as valid identification. This kind of ordinance is achieving great benefits for Chicago, and other communities, and it can work in Columbus too. The great majority of undocumented immigrants who are arrested are not criminals; they simply do not have valid or "acceptable" identification. We need to stop wasting tax dollars on arresting people who have families because of minor traffic violations.

We have discovered that some local law enforcement agencies seem to lack up-to date knowledge of the security features, the underlying database, and the verifiable nature of the Matricula Consular. Because of this, they tell us that the Matricula is not acceptable—but we know that it is! We are expecting a fight. Some local officials are saying they will not accept the Matricula. So what are we going to do about this? Do we just give up? NO!

#### **Mental Health**

The Mental Health committee has met with representatives from a dozen mental health agencies. Here are the problems that they have identified:

#### **Possible Problem Area 1: Access to Care**

There is a lack of mental healthcare providers, specifically psychologists and psychiatrists. Some local mental health agencies report a lack of collaboration, negatively impacting quality of care.

Many agencies are only 9 am - 5 pm when people are working

#### **Possible Problem Area 2: Crisis Situations & Inpatient Care**

One in five people will experience a crisis situation this year.

In Franklin County, if you are in a crisis situation, your options are to go to an Emergency Room at a local hospital or to Netcare Access, a 24 hour mental health and substance abuse crisis intervention.

Emergency Rooms are not equipped to address mental health crisis situations in a timely manner.

Netcare Access is often over capacity. Clients wait on extra mattresses placed on the floors in the hallways of the agency when they are full.

The number of inpatient beds is inadequate and there is a waitlist for inpatient psychiatric beds. There are even less resources available for children.

#### **Possible Problem Area 3: Poor Physical Health Outcomes for People with Severe Mental Illness**

In the state of Ohio, people with 'severe and persistent mental illness' die, on average, 27 years earlier due to a non-Mental Health related condition. This means that they are dying, on average, at 51 years old from physical health problems that have gone untreated, including heart disease, cancer, and cerebrovascular, respiratory, and lung diseases. This is worse than the national average.

### **Report of Future Activities:**

We have planned the "Welcome Columbus!" event on March 27th at 1 p.m. at Christ the King Catholic Church (2777 East Livingston Ave). This event will bring together the Mexican Consulate, law enforcement, stakeholders, and representatives from Dayton and Chicago who have succeeded in making their communities more welcoming. The City Attorney has committed to be there, and he is a key player in our goal of getting a "Welcoming City" Ordinance that will protect the Matricula Consular and help immigrants in our congregations! We need you to be there.

We also need to get all of our Network Members to the Rally to hear testimonies and our Action Plan! We will not rest until we win victories for the immigrants in our congregations and community! BREAD...Rises!

**Report on Activities:**

1. Maintenance committee was formed and comprised of Tim Foley, Mark Bobulski, Bill Dougherty, Paul Schafhausen, Marcello
2. Boiler in church had a problem with cutting out, it has been fixed.
3. A needed outlet that had to be installed for the chemical pump in the school boiler was completed
4. Boiler Tech a company that only services boiler, will be at the parish to do a safety inspection on all the boilers.
5. Two electrical companies were contacted and came out to look at putting in the electrical service for our lift in the basement
6. We are looking at doing repairs on the bells in front of the church but not until after July 1 our new budget period. The cost for doing the whole service would be \$20,000. This will probably be done in stages if the company will allow it

8. We have a new landscape company called NexGreen that will be taking care of our outside lawn and shrubs. They will be putting down environmentally friendly fertilizer on the lawn.
